Cold Weather Safety Tips

Winter is a wonderful time of year. Spending time with your family, the many holidays, the New Year, snow and the warmth from a fireplace all remind us of the upcoming season. But, as with any time of the year, there are specific things we need to be aware of to keep our family safe and injury-free.

Carbon Monoxide Detectors

According to the Centers for Disease Control, most carbon monoxide poisonings happen in January; the second most December. Carbon monoxide detectors save lives, but less than one-third of American homes have one installed.

Make sure they are all in working order and test them every month.

If it has been over 10 years since your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide sensors have been replaced, swap them out for new ones.

Snowy Driving Conditions

Fatal crashes were 14% more likely to happen on the first snowy day of the season than on days following snow accumulation. It takes drivers a few days to regain their sense of driving in this weather.

Aggressive or improper driving is a factor in nearly 60 percent of all fatal accidents, and includes behaviors such as speeding, frequent and unnecessary lane changes, tailgating and running red or vellow lights. These actions put your family and other drivers in danger.

Preventing Home Fires

Home fires are more prevalent in the winter other months than any season. Cooking is the leading cause of all winter residential building fires. Other winter fire hazards include space heaters. fireplaces and candles.

If a fire occurs in your

- Never open a door that feels hot. Escape another
- Take the safest route, but if you have to go through your nose and mouth with a moist towel (if possible) or an article of clothing.
- Immediately leave your house, and then call for help.
