Old Mill Mobile Home Park Residents Relocated

On February 10, 2015, Ogden Holding Inc., the owner of the Old Mill Mobile Home Park (OMMHP) in Middleport announced its intention to close the mobile home park and to sell the property to FMC Corporation. This decision was made after extensive discussions between FMC and Ogden Holding, in light of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation's (NYSDEC's) letter requesting that FMC evaluate possible interim actions for the property.

In September 2014, NYSDEC directed FMC to consider interim remedial options for the mobile home park based on the residential use of the property and soil samples showing elevated arsenic levels.

Representatives from FMC, NYSDEC, and the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) spoke with Old Mill Mobile Home Park residents on November 13, 2014 about NYSDEC's direction to FMC at the mobile home park, including FMC's review of possible scenarios for addressing contaminated soil at the property. Throughout the process, FMC has been committed to working in a manner that is respectful of those living in the neighborhood, as well as working with the agencies to follow all laws and regulations.

During FMC's consideration of remedial options, FMC determined remediation and reconstruction of the park would likely take years to complete and could result in

significant disruption to the mobile home park and its residents and complications arising from the property's location within a floodplain. Accordingly, it was determined that operation of the mobile home park was no longer feasible without material disruption and uncertainty to its residents, and Ogden Holding and FMC entered into an agreement of sale for the property. FMC also announced it would provide help to relocate park residents.

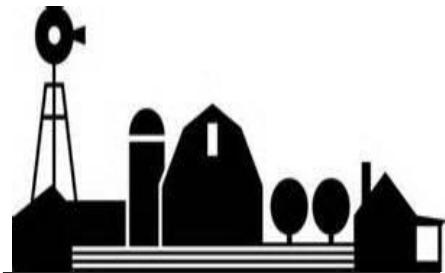
FMC attended the meeting on February 10, 2015, during which Ogden Holding made its announcement. FMC informed residents that it is offering a Mobile Home Park Relocation Program to all residents to help find and transition to new housing.

FMC provided residents with assistance in identifying and moving to new housing. This program provided reimbursement of relocation expenses and has ensured home owners received fair market value for their homes. We have helped relocate all but one family, planning to move this fall.

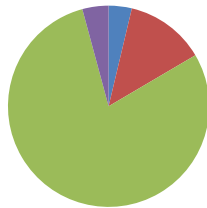
ARSENIC IS ELEVATED IN MUCH AGRICULTURAL LAND

FMC MIDDLEPORT PLANT UPDATES

- Currently, the plant is in peak production for the North American planting season which will continue throughout the entire summer.
- Prebuilding of products and systems is underway for the upcoming South American planting season.
- Furadan system at the plant is 100% operational for the export of the insecticide product post November 2014 fire incident.
- A new packaging line supporting the insecticide business was developed to improve capacity, cost and ability to service customers.
- In the first quarter of 2015, FMC Middleport donated to the following organizations/events: Gasport Lions Club Winterfest, Boy Scouts and the Mr. Ed's Race and Scholarship Program.

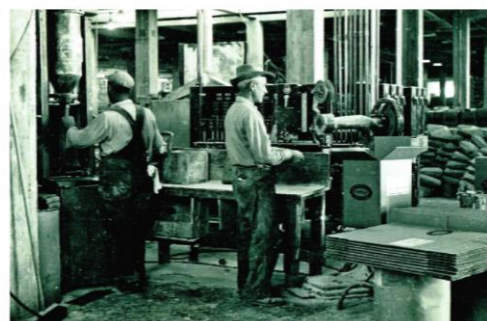
FMC Middleport Products Help Farmers

Key FMC agricultural product lines are formulated at Middleport: Furdan®, an insecticide used on rice, corn, and alfalfa; Talstar®, an insecticide used on termites, structural pests, and wood damaging insects and Command®, a herbicide used on cotton, peas, soybeans and sweet potatoes. A number of other products are also mixed and packaged in smaller volumes.



While the plant has not manufactured any chemical products in Middleport since 1985, the mixing and packaging facility is one of FMC's largest formulating plants. The active ingredients required to formulate our products are produced at other locations and shipped by truck or rail to Middleport.

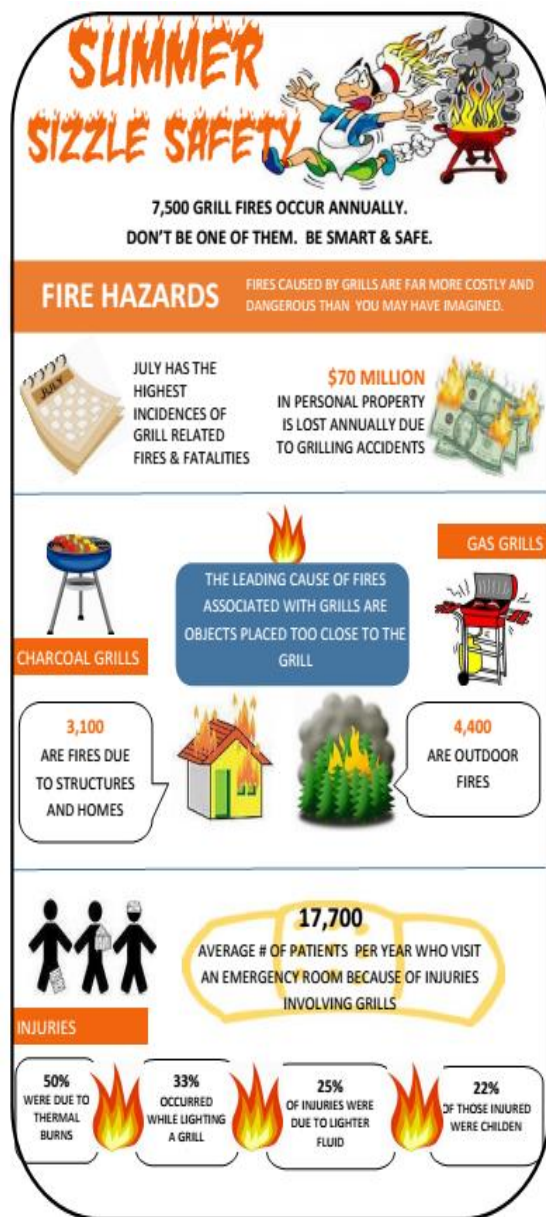
Active ingredients shipped to Middleport are mixed and packaged according to strict standards and best practices. During the mixing and packaging of products, FMC's monitoring equipment, including collection and ventilation systems, automatic shut-down controls and safety interlocks, leak prevention and containment systems, help to protect our employees, neighbors and the environment.

The Middleport plant supports growers' requirements for a variety of formulations, including dustless powders, micro-encapsulated liquid and flowable liquids.

Once packaged, crop protection products are shipped to North American and overseas customers. Without products like these, farmers world-wide would not be able to produce abundant crops, food prices would increase and some food might not even be available. FMC is committed to being a partner with growers to meet the world's increasing food demands today and tomorrow.



FMC Corporation Completes Acquisition of Cheminova A/S; Broadens Ag Solutions

FMC Corporation has completed the closing of its acquisition of Cheminova A/S, a multinational crop protection company based in Denmark and a wholly-owned subsidiary of Auriga Industries A/S. The companies announced the signing of a definitive acquisition agreement on September 8, 2014, and have now satisfied all necessary conditions and regulatory approvals.

FMC completed the acquisition of Cheminova for an aggregate purchase price of approximately \$1.8 billion, including assumption of debt. FMC expects the transaction to be accretive to adjusted earnings in the first full year following the acquisition.

"The acquisition of Cheminova is fully aligned with our corporate strategy to focus

FMC's portfolio on agriculture, health and nutrition end markets," said Pierre Brondeau, FMC president, CEO and chairman. "Cheminova has a highly complementary product portfolio and geographic footprint and follows a similar strategic approach to FMC in applying technology to deliver solutions to its customers. This transaction will broaden our Agricultural Solutions portfolio and significantly strengthen our market access."

Brondeau continued, "Cheminova gives us direct market access to key countries in Europe and enhances our customer reach in India, Australia and throughout Latin America, bringing greater balance to our agricultural business. Its technology will enable us to expand FMC's position in existing crops;

accelerate access to additional crops, such as cereals; and strengthen our offerings to customers, especially in sugarcane, soybeans and cotton. We expect to further enhance our innovation pipeline and generate significant new revenue opportunities for the combined business."

FMC has been realigning its business portfolio in recent years to expand its position in the crop protection market. With the acquisition of Cheminova, and the divestiture of the Alkali Chemicals business completed on April 1, 2015, FMC Agricultural Solution is expected to represent approximately three quarters of the company's total revenue, up from less than 40 percent as recently as 2009.

SHRIMP & WATERMELON SUMMER SALAD from Better Homes & Gardens

The refreshing taste of watermelon combined with shrimp, tomatoes, and bok choy with a drizzle of lime juice makes this the perfect summertime recipe to serve for lunch or a light dinner.

INGREDIENTS

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 pound peeled, deveined shrimp
- 2 teaspoons fresh thyme
- 4 cups sliced bok choy or napa cabbage
- 1 cup grape tomatoes, halved
- Salt and ground pepper
- 2 one inch slices seedless watermelon, halved
- Small limes, halved
- Fresh thyme
- Feta cheese, optional

1. Heat 1 tablespoon of olive oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Add shrimp. Cook and stir for 3-4 minutes or until shrimp is opaque.
2. Transfer shrimp to a bowl; stir in thyme. Add remaining olive oil, bok choy, and tomatoes to skillet; cook and stir for 1 minutes. Return shrimp to skillet; cook and stir for 1 minute more. Season with salt and pepper.
3. Serve shrimp and vegetables with watermelon. Squeeze lime juice on salad. Sprinkle with thyme sprigs and feta cheese.
